

HARDYSTON TOWNSHIP RECYCLING PROGRAM

MONTHLY CURBWISE COLLECTION OF RECYCLABLE MATERIALS IS PROVIDED TO ALL HARDYSTON RESIDENTS.

- The following should be placed out the night before at the curb for recycling pick-up. Co-mingled recycling must be placed in a reusable container. DO NOT PLACE IN PLASTIC OR PAPER BAGS.
- All recycling materials must be free of food and/or waste. Caps and lids are garbage.
- Newspapers, magazines, junk mail must be bundled in one-foot stacks and cross-tied. Corrugated cardboard must be flattened and cross-tied. Paper products may also be placed in reusable container.
- Please have recycling out the night before pickup day or by 5:00 AM day of pickup.
- The day after a holiday, please have recycling out by 3:00 AM

NOTE: Hardyston residents may also deposit recyclable free of charge at the Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority (SCMUA) Recycling Center located on State Highway 94 in Lafayette Township. The SCMUA facility is open Monday through Saturday (except holidays) from 7:00 AM to 2:00 PM. For additional information on the SCMUA Recycling Center, please call 973-579-6998.

Additional Recycling Route

Due to the excellent participation in our curbside recycling program there is a need to add an additional route to efficiently manage the pick up schedule. There will be a total of three(3) pickups per month starting with the first full week of the month as follows;

Pick up 1-(South 1) First Tuesday/Commingled, First Wednesday/Paper
 Pick up 2-(South 2) Second Tuesday/Commingled, Second Wednesday/Paper
 Pick up 3-(North 1) Third Tuesday/Commingled, Third Wednesday/Paper

Pick up 1 First full week of the month
 Service Area;(South 1)

Starting at the township boundary at the West Millford line on route 23 North to the intersection of CTY Rt 517 at the bottom of Beaver Lake Mtn all residents to the left of this line shall be picked up,this includes areas such as, Lake Stockholm,Lake Tamarack,Summit Lake and Laceytown rd. as well as all roads within this border

Pick up 2 Second full week of the month
 Service area;(South 2)

Starting at the township boundary at the West Millford line on route 23 North to the intersection of route 94 in Hamburg to the Vernon line all residents to the right of this line shall be picked up,this includes areas from CTY RT 515 ,Deertrail Lakes, Mtn rd and CTY RT 517 as well as all roads within this border

Pick up 3 Third full week of the month
 Service Area;(North 1)

Starting at CTY RT 517 and Route 23 at the bottom of Beaver Lake Mtn to the intersection of route 94 in Hamburg to the Vernon line all residents to the left of this line shall be picked up,this includes North Church Road,Davis Road,Big Spring rd,Scenic Lakes and all roads west of RT 23 as well as all roads within this border, all of Crystal Springs has been added to this route

RECYCLABLE MATERIALS: (Rinse all aluminum, tin and bi-metal cans, glass, plastic bottles and jugs.)

Aluminum, tin, and bi-metal food or beverage cans:

- DO recycle food and beverage cans only
- DON'T remove labels from cans
- DON'T recycle paint, chemical or spray cans

Glass:

- DO remove neck rings and caps and dispose of these in trash
- DON'T remove labels
- DON'T recycle flat glass, mirrors, light bulbs, blue glass, ceramics or windows

PETE Bottles:

- DO recycle bottles with a Number 1 in the recycle symbol & the letters PETE on the bottom
- DO remove metal neck rings and dispose of these in trash
- DON'T recycle PETE jars

HDPE Bottles:

- DO recycle only milk, juice, cider, water, laundry & dish detergent, bleach, and shampoo bottles/jugs with a Number 2 in the recycle symbol and the letters HDPE on the bottom
- DON'T recycle HDPE jars
- DON'T recycle motor oil and antifreeze bottles and jugs

Newspapers:

- DO cross-tie in stacks no more than 1-foot high
- DON'T put newspapers in paper or plastic bags... THEY WILL NOT BE TAKEN

Magazines and Mixed Paper:

- DO cross-tie magazines and mixed paper with string in stacks no more than 1-foot high
- DO recycle junk mail, manila file folders, copier paper, FAX paper, mixed office paper, catalogues, soft covered workbooks, paperback books, white and yellow writing paper, carbonless paper, construction paper without glue or sparkles, index cards, gift wrapping paper, phone books and hand bound books with cover removed.
- DON'T use rope or plastic to tie bundles
- DON'T put magazines and mixed paper in paper or plastic bags; they WILL NOT be taken
- DON'T include cardboard, newsprint, brown paper, carbon paper, accordion files or booklets with plastic rings with the magazines and mixed paper

Corrugated Cardboard and Kraft (brown paper) Bags:

- DO flatten cardboard boxes; un-flattened boxes WILL NOT be taken
- DO recycle only corrugated cardboard
- DO recycle Kraft bags with cardboard
- DO cross-tie cardboard and Kraft bags

Household Batteries:

- DO recycle AA, AAA, C, D, 9-Volt and button type batteries
 - DO co-mingle batteries
 - DON'T set out automotive batteries for pick-up
- *Household batteries must be placed in sealed container / do not expose to elements

Note: Unused Motor Oil, Oil Filters and Antifreeze

Will not be picked up at curbside. These may be brought to the SCMUA Recycling Center. Up to 5 gallons per day will be accepted. There is no charge for disposal at the SCMUA.

Please be sure trash and recycling containers are clearly visible from the road.

If there is inclement weather, please listen for changes or cancellations on 102.3 FM.

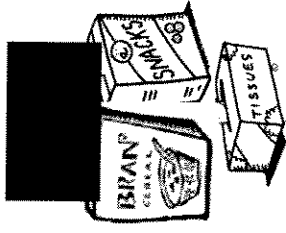
If you miss your curbside pick-up, you may bring your recyclables to the SCMUA Recycling Center, located on Route 94, just north of the intersection of Routes 15 & 94, Monday through Saturday from 7 AM to 2 PM. SCMUA's phone number is 973-579-6998.

If you bring your trash to the SCMUA landfill, please look for separate containers at the convenience center for propane tanks, car batteries, tires, carpets and carpet padding.

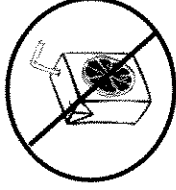

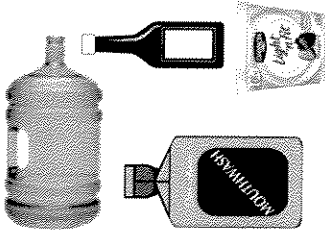
Can Now Recycle:

No wax coated material (i.e. Juice Boxes).

Plastic Containers  -  : All rinsed plastic containers with codes between 1 (PET) and 7 (OTHER) can be included with commingled containers.
No plastic toys.

New Acceptable Recycling Materials

Number	Type of plastic	Common packaging uses	Common recycled use
#1	Polyethylene terephthalate (PETE or PET)	Beverage and food bottles and containers	Textiles, including clothing and carpet; film, food, and beverage containers; luggage.
#2	High density polyethylene (HDPE)	Beverage and food bottles and containers; dish and laundry detergent bottles;	Nonfood containers, including laundry detergent, shampoo, conditioner, and motor oil bottles; plastic lumber, pipe, buckets, crates, flower pots, film, recycling bins, floor tiles.
#3	Polyvinyl chloride (PVC or vinyl)	Food and non-food packaging; medical tubing; siding, window frames, floor tiles and carpet backing	Packaging, loose-leaf binders, decking, paneling, gutters, mud flaps, film, floor tiles and mats, electrical equipment, traffic cones, garden hoses, mobile home skirting
#4	Low density polyethylene (LDPE)	squeezable bottles	Shipping envelopes, garbage can liners, floor tile, plastic lumber, film, compost bins, trash cans
#5	Polypropylene (PP)	Food and medicine containers and bottles	Automobile battery cases, signal lights, brooms, brushes, ice scrapers, oil funnels, bicycle racks, rakes
#6	Polystyrene (PS)	Cups, plates, cutlery, compact disc jackets, clear hard & brittle bottles and food service containers	Thermometers, light switch plates, thermal insulation, egg cartons, vents, rulers, license plate frames, foam packing and dishware
#7	Other (often polycarbonate (PC))	Reusable water bottles, beverage and food bottles	Bottles, plastic lumber

Paperboard or Chipboard: Some chipboard is plastic coated and is not acceptable. The way to identify plastic coated materials is a simple tear test. If you CAN tear it, you CAN recycle it. Examples of chipboard that CAN be recycled are: cereal and cracker boxes (throw away the liners), pasta, laundry detergent, gift, and shoe boxes, soda and beer cartons, frozen juice containers (throw away lids and plastic tabs), all boxes used as packaging for toothpaste, bar soap, over the counter and prescription medicines, dry goods packaging, and paper towel and toilet paper cores.
